Hello there, all of you beloved saints of God! This year the ELCA has adopted the phrase “Walking Dusty” to help us all frame the context and goals for a successful Lenten season. Traditionally, Lent has been marked by a somber tone, a melancholy quietness, dirge-y music and dark colors (as if the world around us isn’t sad enough!). We have been told to reflect upon our sin and ‘repent’; sound advice, indeed, but pretty tough without realistic and practical examples for application.

Likewise, the season of Lent has traditionally made a number of Lutherans uncomfortable, because it has reflected more popular trends than sound, Reformation theology. The invitation to look deeply into one’s self and become introspective, even about sin, does not necessarily keep Christ at the center of all things. If taken too far, Lent becomes a season ‘about us’ and not ‘for us’.

In these days of mission and transformation, at Christ the King and throughout the entire ELCA, we are wrestling with both the dangers and the consequences of poorly applied theology. As the Christian Church in the US continues to shrink and demonstrate scant relevance, we struggle to replace the needs, wants, comforts, traditions of the congregation with God and God’s mission and purpose for the Church.

For the season of Lent, “Walking Dusty” is a good way to frame our discipleship-in-context. ‘Walking’ implies both Jesus’ call to follow him, as well as God’s mission: to go and make disciples and be witnesses at home and to the ends of the earth. ‘Dusty’ implies that we not only remember but celebrate that we are creation and not Creator; that we grieve and mourn our brokenness and sin, knowing that God’s work is reconciliation and grace; that we are not only willing, by God’s grace and gift of the Holy Spirit, to walk the long road of discipleship, but we are ready, with God’s help, to roll up our sleeves and get dirty!

This is the marketing promo for the Walk Dusty campaign:

As we prepare for Ash Wednesday and Lent let us remember that it is a long and dusty road. It is on this journey that we reflect on those who have gone before and those who will come after. We identify with the hurt and the pain. We live in the messiness that comes with the often dirty road that we must travel. Let us also remember that it is this dust we call life that shapes and forms us into resurrection people. Just as we walk wet in recognition of our baptism and the promise that it holds we encourage you this year to Walk Dusty. Remember that in the brokenness, we are healed. While the journey is long and tiresome, resurrection promises are greater. In our dusty walk we claim the promise of new sandals and clean garments. As we walk dusty we remember that we have come from dust and to dust we shall return.

As we begin this new journey together, the journey of Lent and the journey of Transformational (transformation + mission) Ministry, it will be a great time to reflect and have some study and conversation. I’d like to invite any and all to join me for 3 Walking Dusty/Transformational Ministry conversations – Wednesday March 8, Wednesday March 22, and Wednesday April 5. It would certainly behoove us to meet and talk and pray and read scripture out in the local community, but for the first gathering let us meet at Christ the King at 7 pm.

Transformational Ministry

Christ the King is one of 66 congregations in the ELCA who are receiving a partnership support grant to assist with Transformational Ministry. Six of those congregations are in our own Synod. Although Synod’s grant support is for three years, it is like seed money to get us started on our forever journey.

The Domestic Mission Unit of the ELCA is commissioned to provide leadership and support for the ELCA as it reaches out in witness to the Gospel in the areas served by the synods of this church. A principal Domestic Mission function is to provide assistance and support to synods for missional ministry and outreach planning, and offer support to existing congregations that are involved in renewal for the church through change and growth that leads to expanded capacity to serve their communities through outreach with the Gospel. The partnership support totals \$2.2 million. This is just one way that our contributions to Synod help the wider church.
