Aluminum Can Tab Collection Results

Thank you to all who contributed can tabs! The following is from Gary Roller of the Synod Assembly Planning Team.

A couple of tidbits before I give you the final results of the 2017 Synod Assembly Can Tab Collection Project:

• It takes 1400 can tabs to equal one pound. Across the Upstate NY Synod, we collected 407 pounds of can tabs. If I have done the math correctly, that equates to 569,800 can tabs collected.

Can tabs come in every color of the rainbow plus the many other colors that are in a box of Crayola Crayons (the 64-variety size box).

Collections were brought to the Synod Assembly in a variety of containers. This included boxes, buckets, animal cracker containers, pretzel containers, contractor trash bags and a couple of glass vases. The total dollar amount that we realized is \$163.79. The Synod Assembly Planning Team will make a decision at our August meeting where the money will be sent. That information will be published when the decision is made.
