Report of the Mini Town Hall Meeting, July 23, 2017

The first 'regular' mini town hall meeting of the congregation was held on Sunday July 23, immediately following the 9:00 AM summer worship service. The purpose of the meeting was to foster an atmosphere of open and honest dialogue within a congregation in transition. The following items were addressed:

*Some members of the congregation are upset because they do not like the changes made to worship for the summer months. Pastor AJ and the Leadership Team responded that it was clearly advertised the changes were only for a short while, to explore alternative trends to summer attendance. This was the first of what will be many experiments, and a great deal was learned by it.

*Some members of the congregation are upset that there is a lack of communication about what is going on at CTK. Pastor AJ and the Leadership Team responded that this appears to be a repeating pattern in the life of this congregation. Information from the Pastor and the Leadership Team is published regularly in the monthly and weekly newsletters, the weekly bulletins, on the CTK website, on the CTK FaceBook page, and announcements are broadcast at the end of each worship service. The congregation must be proactive in its quest for readily available communication. A regularly scheduled Mini Town Hall meeting will help to foster a sense of open communication in the congregation.

*Some members of the congregation believe the Synod wants CTK to close. Pastor AJ and the Leadership Team responded that NOBODY wants CTK to close! Nobody. How would that serve the Body of Christ? However, the congregation trends in attendance and giving show a steady decline. The congregation is on the verge of no longer being self-sustainable. Transformational Ministry was offered to the congregation to help address this before it is too late.

*Some members of the congregation are upset because they didn't really understand what Transformational Ministry was before they agreed to it. Pastor AJ and the Leadership Team listened to this concern. Although the Leadership Team assures the congregation that full disclosure was made prior to the congregational vote in 2016, all that we can really do at this point is make the best of it as we discern how God is using us here and now.

The next Mini Town Hall meeting is scheduled for Sunday September 10, immediately following the 10:00AM worship service.

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday will be observed on September 17. We will be meeting at the Discovery Center at noon. There will be a short prayer service upon arrival. There are jobs for everyone. Worship Ministry Team

In the book Inside Out: Worship in an Age of Mission, Mark Bangert, Professor of Worship and Music at the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago writes, "Christians are always tempted to keep liturgy and evangelism far apart from each other. Our task is easier that way. Evangelism can be ignored altogether, or it can be reconfigured as if it were a matter for specialization, a function for the interested few. Without a close bond between liturgy and mission, worship is too easily transformed, as if it were merely an aesthetically pleasing ingredient in one's personal quest for things spiritual - liturgy reduced to a ritual hot water bottle for those with spiritual chills. Turned in on itself in such a way, liturgy evolves into a spiritual concert for the lonely."

There really is no doubt that God is inviting the whole Church to explore how and why we worship. The declining numbers in congregations of most mainline Churches should be as clear as a card with the words 'You Are Invited' printed on it. Yet, for many the choice remains familiarity and preference over mission. As wonderful as it is to be "called" and "gathered", we are those things for the express and intentional purpose of being "sent."

We are going to spend some intentional time looking at how to better and more expressly reflect these things in our corporate worship time. A small, select group of individuals, along with AJ and Jim, are going to be charged with this Transformational Ministry task, both for the 9:00am and 11:15am services. If you think you'd be interested in serving in this capacity, please let AJ know.

Please note, this is not about who is reading the lessons and which team is setting up for communion. Nothing about that is changing for the time being.

Transformational Ministry Progress Report

The first of CTK's Transformational Ministry Progress Reports is presently due to the Synod and the Domestic Mission Unit of the ELCA. As you are already aware, the mutually covenanted and accountable work of Transformational Ministry comes with expectations and responsibilities on both sides. As the ELCA and the Synod support the work of Transformational Ministry financially, one of our jobs is to show them what is being done.

The report asks the following questions:

1. Tell stories of what happened in your ministry as a result of receiving this partnership support grant.
 - *How is the Holy Spirit working in, with, and through the congregation?
 - *How has your community/neighborhood been impacted by your ministry?
2. How has your congregation changed?
 - *What intentional changes did you make?
 - *What still needs to change?
 - *What have you learned?
3. What learnings are you willing to share with others?
 - *What do you still want to learn?

The Leadership Team is preparing the report, which will then be reviewed by the Synod Mission Table, and then forwarded to the Domestic Mission Unit of the ELCA, in Chicago.

The finished report will be shared with the congregation at a November mini town hall meeting.

A Return to the Basics - Small Group Study

When members of CTK are interviewed, and when they talk about how their faith has been nurtured and nourished at CTK, many refer back to times when Small Groups were a big deal in the life of this congregation. Small Groups allow for the development of authentic relationships and experiences. Small Groups focus on community and sharing. Small Groups is how the Christian Church actually started!

In the hopes of building an even stronger community at CTK - one whose love and commitment to God's mission is visibly reflected in their life together - we are going to experiment with Small Groups this Fall and Winter. There are already some Small Groups that exist at CTK. That's awesome. However, new ones will also be formed.

We are going to ask that the WHOLE CTK COMMUNITY take part in a Small Group Book Study starting in October of 2017. We are going to look at the book *Slow Church*, and explore ways to build healthier relationships (with God and each other) and create an even stronger community of faith.

If you already lead a Small Group, Great!!! We will provide you all the material necessary to lead this 11 week conversation with your group. If you would like to put a new Small Group together, Great!!! We absolutely encourage that. And remember, meeting AWAY from the church building and out in the public eye is strongly encouraged, although not required.
