To my chagrin, the birth of my first grandchild transformed me from a cynic to a gushing collection of endless photos. Of course, all of you experienced grandparents out there have already discovered this, but I thought it would never happen to me. There is just something extraordinary about the miraculous wonder of new life; new babies are truly the incarnation of hope for us all. It is no wonder that we react so strongly to the story of the birth of Jesus. Notice I didn't say the birth of the Christ, or even 'the birth of the Christ child'. No, I think it is the baby that pulls us in.

Last Christmas I was meeting with a small Bible study group each week at our local Panera. We had been meeting there for a while when Christmas rolled around and I raised the question, 'Why do folks who never grace the inside of a sanctuary any other time of the year, come on Christmas Eve?' The group kicked it around, and then I boldly approached my fellow coffee drinkers and asked them. 'Just a survey,' I told them. "If Christmas Eve is generally the only time you attend, then why do you go?"

We had some great conversation with all kinds of folks. The most frequent answer was 'tradition'. Most of these folks admitted that they rarely attended any other time of the year, including the great feast of Easter. Just Christmas Eve....and I think it is the baby.

It certainly does not come from a deep understanding of the implications of an incarnate God. It does not happen because of exquisite choirs and top quality preaching. I think folks come because the story is their story, it is our story. We know vulnerability and innocence, even if it is innocence lost. We know the struggle of parents to provide and protect their children. We know the pressure of powers unseen yet clearly present.

Possibly we would like to think that somewhere there are choirs of angels rejoicing at new life, and powers beyond our understanding who are watching over us. We would like to believe that in the midst of the realities of making our way in this life in this world, that there exists a Divine One whose default is love. We truly long for a benevolent, merciful, life-giving God.

So we travel again to peek into the manger with the eyes of expectant grandparents. Once again we are seeking the answer to the question, "Is this the one?" Will this ancient child transform me from cynic to gushing grandma? Will this story change the trajectory of my life? Is this Jesus truly HOPE for me and for the world?

I think that none of us can ever get too much of the promise that lies in that Bethlehem manger. Let us invite our friends and neighbors to discover this gift of hope again this year. Let us welcome old friends and strangers into our midst to celebrate this gift of life.

I believe we attend Christmas Eve services because of the deep longing of a fragile and often lost people for the hope that comes from the Divine. Say to all you meet, "Come and see what God has done for us."
